5th Convocation Ceremony held at Guru Kashi University with Great Academic Pride

The 5th Convocation of Guru Kashi University was held on January 25, 2026 with great enthusiasm and academic pride on campus. The ceremony was graced by Mr. G. Pradeep Saputhanthri, Secretary to the Prime Minister of Sri Lanka and Attorney-at-Law, Supreme Court of Sri Lanka, as the Chief Guest. The event was presided over by GKU Chancellor S. Gurlabh Singh Sidhu.

Distinguished dignitaries present included Prof. (Dr.) K. Shivachithappa, Vice-Chancellor, Mandya University, and Prof. (Dr.) Raghavendra Prasad Tiwari, Vice-Chancellor, Central University of Punjab, Bathinda along with members of the University Management, Deans, and faculty members.

Prof. (Dr.) Jagtar Singh Dhiman, Registrar, led the Convocation Procession and conducted the proceedings. He presented the citations of the honorary degree awardees and extended his best wishes to the graduating students.

In his address, the Chief Guest Mr. Saputhanthri congratulated the graduates and described convocation as a milestone in a student's life. He highlighted that the academic collaboration agreement between Sri Lanka and Guru Kashi University would serve as a bridge for launching new joint



programs in higher education. Emphasizing global educational transformation, he urged institutions to frame forward-looking policies aligned with international standards.

In his presidential address, Chancellor S. Gurlabh Singh Sidhu congratulated the medalists and graduates, expressing confidence that they would take meaningful initiatives in their respective fields. He also appreciated the University's growing international recognition in higher education.

Vice-Chancellor Prof. (Dr.) Rameshwar Singh, in his report, outlined the University's key achievements, including the attainment of NAAC Grade A++. He described the bilateral agreement between Guru Kashi University and Oxford Chester University (Sri Lanka) as a historic

milestone that would open new avenues for academic, research, cultural, and diplomatic collaboration between India and Sri Lanka. He also highlighted the University's online education initiatives and developments under the National Education Policy 2020, along with progress in research, publications, the GKU Newsletter, library resources, and the Fine Arts Gallery.

On the occasion, Dr. Dulan Hitiyaarachi (Sri Lanka) was conferred the honorary D.Litt. degree for contributions to international diplomacy, while Mr. Gaurav Malhotra (Australia) received the D.Litt. for his work in social service.

Students with outstanding academic achievements were honoured with 12 A. P. J. Abdul Kalam Gold Medals, one Chancellor's Medal, and one Vice-Chancellor's Medal.

A total of 543 degrees were awarded during the ceremony, including 66 Ph.D., 10 PG Diploma, 142 Master's, and 325 Bachelor's degrees, marking a proud academic milestone for the University and its graduates.



Three-day National Training Course on Land Safety Protocol Inaugurated

The Faculty of Physical Education at Guru Kashi University, in collaboration with the Rashtriya Life Saving Society (RLSS), commenced a three-day National Training Course based on Land Safety Protocol. Youth in Action: NSS Initiatives At GKU

The “Special Cleanliness Drive – Swachhta Camp,” held on 21 January 2026, significantly enhanced campus hygiene while fostering environmental awareness, civic duty, and teamwork among participants.



Oilseed Crops and Beekeeping: A Sustainable Diversification Model of Punjab Agriculture

Punjab's agriculture is at a turning point. The wheat-paddy rotation, though historically successful in ensuring national food security, has placed immense pressure on groundwater, soil health, and farm economics. Rising input costs and stagnating profitability demand a strong shift toward crop diversification. In this context, oilseed crops, particularly rapeseed, mustard, and gobhi sarson, offer a scientifically sound, economically rewarding, and ecologically sustainable alternative, especially for the south-western region of the state. In Punjab, during 2023-24, oilseeds were grown on an area of 43.1 thousand hectares, giving an average production and productivity of 69.4 thousand ton, and 16.1 quintal/hectare, respectively.

India continues to depend heavily on imports to meet its edible oil demand. Increasing domestic oilseed production is, therefore, a strategic necessity. Rapeseed and mustard fit well into Punjab's rabi season, require comparatively less irrigation and provide multiple economic returns. The crop not only yields edible oil but also produces oilcake, a protein-rich by-product that strengthens the dairy sector. With proper management, farmers can obtain yields of 7-10 quintals per acre, and progressive

cultivators are achieving even higher productivity.

The south-western districts of Punjab, characterized by suitable winter temperatures and relatively lighter soils, are particularly ideal for rapeseed and mustard cultivation. Recommended varieties in the state include raya (PHR 127, RCH 1, PHR 126, Giriraj, RLC 3, PBR 357, PBR 97, PBR 91), gobhi sarson (*Brassica napus*) (PGSH 2155, PGSH 1707, GSC 7, GSC 6), African sarson (PC 6), and



Taramira (TMLC 2). Gobhi sarson is emerging as a preferred option due to its high oil content and better yield potential.

In the current season, Guru Kashi University has successfully demonstrated the GSL-7 variety of gobhi sarson in its research and instructional fields. The crop was sown in mid-October using 1.5 kilograms of seed per acre, maintaining a spacing of 45 cm between rows and 10-15 cm between plants, with a sowing depth of 5 cm. For optimal growth, about 90 kilograms of urea and 75 kilograms of phosphorus per acre

were applied, through single super phosphate. The entire dose of phosphorus and potash along with half of the nitrogen was applied at sowing, while the remaining nitrogen was top-dressed before the first irrigation. Irrigation needs to be ensured at critical stages such as flowering, pod formation and grain filling. Timely hand weeding, first after one month and again three weeks later, keep the crop free from weeds. If required, the recommended use of 350 ml pendimethalon 38.7 SC, per acre in 200 litres of water is used. The standing crop in the university fields clearly reflects the potential of gobhi sarson under scientific management.

However, our belief is that fertilizer use should ideally be guided by soil testing rather than blanket recommendations. Farmers can get their soil analyzed at the laboratories of Guru Kashi University or at the headquarters and outstations of Punjab Agricultural University. Balanced nutrient management not only reduces unnecessary expenditure but also safeguards long-term soil fertility.

Mustard seeds contain around 38-42 percent oil, making the crop economically attractive. Oil extraction can be undertaken through traditional expellers or modern solvent extraction plants. The establishment of small-scale oil processing units in rural areas can generate employment and promote value addition. The residual oilcake remains a valuable livestock feed, creating an integrated farming advantage.

From a health perspective, mustard and gobhi sarson oil offer significant benefits. They are rich in mono-unsaturated and poly-unsaturated fatty acids, including omega-3 and omega-6 in favorable proportions. Mustard oil contains natural antioxidants and exhibits anti-inflammatory and antimicrobial properties. Improved low-erucic acid (<2%) mustard types are comparable to canola oil, globally recognized for its heart-friendly characteristics. Gobhi sarson oil, with its mild flavor and nutritional richness, supports cardiovascular health when consumed in moderation and continues to hold cultural and culinary importance in North India.

An equally important



dimension of oilseed cultivation is its synergy with beekeeping. The bright yellow flowers of rapeseed and mustard are rich sources of nectar and pollen, making them excellent crops for honeybees. Active bee pollination can increase seed yield by 10-20 percent, directly enhancing farm returns. At the same time, farmers can generate additional income through honey production, beeswax and other bee products. The integration of oilseed cultivation with apiculture creates a diversified and resilient farm economy.

Recognizing this immense potential, Guru Kashi University has obtained a prestigious mega project worth ₹101 lakh from the National Bee Board for honey processing infrastructure. This initiative will strengthen honey value addition, quality control and marketing facilities in the region. The project aligns perfectly with the expansion of oilseed crops, as the extensive flora of rapeseed and mustard provides an ideal nectar base for large-scale beekeeping. The linkage between mustard fields and honey processing units creates a complete value chain, from crop production and pollination to honey extraction, processing and branding, thus multiplying income opportunities for farmers.

Guru Kashi University, through its

ICAR and PSCAE-accredited Faculty of Agriculture, continues to serve regional farmers through education, research and extension. Offering programs from Diploma to Doctorate level, the University collaborates with prominent organizations in seed production and farm research. It has adopted 20 villages adjoining its campus, where technological support is extended to farmers. The University promotes subsidiary occupations such as beekeeping, mushroom cultivation, seed and nursery production, gur making, and vermicomposting. Agreements with progressive farmers further strengthen this participatory extension approach.

Oilseeds are not merely an alternative crop; they represent a pathway to ecological balance, nutritional security and economic resilience for the farming community of Punjab.

The bumper gobhi sarson crop raised in the university fields is a living example of how diversification toward oilseeds can enhance farm profitability while conserving natural resources. By combining oilseed cultivation with beekeeping, value addition and scientific nutrient management, Punjab can move toward a more sustainable and income-secure agricultural model.

Eminent Canadian Scientists Visit GKU, Explore Collaborative Research Opportunities

Guru Kashi University (GKU) had the privilege of hosting two eminent Canadian scientists on February 20, 2026, Dr Shiv O. Prasher, Distinguished James McGill Professor at McGill University, Montreal, and Dr Ramesh P. Rudra, Professor at the University of Guelph, Canada. Both scholars had earlier been conferred the honorary degree of Doctor of Science (*Honoris Causa*) by GKU at its second and third convocations, respectively, and were subsequently inducted into the University's International Advisory Board (IAB).

Dr. Prasher is internationally recognised for his pioneering work on Best/Beneficial Management Practices (BMPs) to reduce non-point source agricultural pollution in tile-drained watersheds under changing climatic conditions. His research spans sustainable wastewater use in agriculture, hydrologic modelling, emerging contaminants (including hormones and veterinary antibiotics), pesticide transport, and the application of artificial intelligence in soil hydrology. His

current work focuses on the role of biochar amendments in reducing environmental pollution from antibiotics, hormones, nanoparticles, pathogens, pesticides, and fertilisers.



Dr Rudra's research has significantly advanced agricultural non-point source pollution control, particularly under Ontario's climatic conditions. His contributions include watershed-scale modelling, temporal variation in soil hydraulic and erosion characteristics, and multi-tier watershed management approaches. He played a key role in introducing advanced modelling tools such as GAMES, GAMESP, and later the SWAT model in the Canadian Great Lakes Basin. His recent research addresses variable source hydrology, climate change impacts on precipitation and temperature regimes,

and nutrient management strategies.

During their visit, the distinguished scientists interacted with the Vice Chancellor, Dr Rameshwar Singh, Pro Vice Chancellor Dr Jagtar Singh Dhiman, and faculty members from agriculture and engineering disciplines. Discussions focused on

pressing regional challenges, including brackish water, problematic soils, and the rising incidence of carcinogenicity in South-Western Punjab. The deliberations identified potential areas of academic collaboration and joint research initiatives.

The University authorities felicitated the visiting scholars and expressed confidence that the engagement would strengthen international research linkages and contribute to sustainable agricultural and environmental solutions.

The cocoons produced are sold to vendors, generating direct income for rural households. Guru Kashi University Integrates Research Ecosystem with Shodh-Chakra Portal

In a significant step towards strengthening research governance and transparency, Guru Kashi University has initiated the uploading of data related to its Ph.D. scholars across various faculties onto the Shodh-Chakra portal, a digital platform developed under the aegis of the University Grants Commission (UGC). To formalise this initiative, the university has entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the INFLIBNET (Information and Library Network) Centre, which administers Shodh-Chakra under the guidance of the UGC.

Highlighting the importance of this development, Deputy Dean (Research), Dr Sudhir Mittal, stated that the initiative will enable systematic tracking of the authenticity and academic progress of PhD scholars. By making relevant information accessible through a centralised platform, the system enhances transparency and allows the stakeholders—including academic peers, institutions, and regulatory bodies—to verify research credentials with ease. He further noted that the portal ensures secure, long-term storage of academic data, safeguarding it for future reference and institutional record-keeping.

Shodh-Chakra is designed

as a comprehensive digital workspace that supports the entire research lifecycle. It provides an integrated platform where researchers, supervisors, and institutions can collaboratively manage research activities—from proposal development to thesis submission.

The onboarding process involves the submission of verified details of researchers and their supervisors. Once registered, the

efficiently. Supervisors, in turn, can monitor progress, provide feedback, and ensure adherence to academic standards. For example, a doctoral scholar working on agricultural sustainability can upload research proposals, maintain datasets, track revisions suggested by the supervisor, and archive final submissions—all within a single, secure interface. This reduces administrative delays and promotes a more structured and accountable research process.

As a NAAC A++ accredited institution, Guru Kashi University continues to adopt progressive measures aimed at academic excellence, efficient governance, and meaningful stakeholder engagement. The integration with Shodh-Chakra reflects the university's commitment to professionalism in data management and the adoption of national-level digital frameworks.

In addition to this, all doctoral theses produced at the university are uploaded to the Shodh Ganga repository, ensuring wider accessibility and contributing to the global pool of academic knowledge. Together, these initiatives position Guru Kashi University at the forefront of digitally enabled research management and academic integrity.

FM GKU 90.4 MHz: Amplifying Voices, Joining Campus and Community

Guru Kashi University proudly stands among the few private universities in Punjab to have a fully functional Community Radio Station (CRS) on its campus, reflecting the university's commitment to innovation in education and meaningful community engagement. The foundation for this milestone was laid in 2017 through the vision and efforts of Pro Vice Chancellor, Dr. Jagtar Singh Dhiman, who envisaged a platform to bridge academia with society. The CRS operates under the supervision of Mr. Rajeev Arora, Director of Media Planning, with strong technical support from RJ Manpreet Kaur Brar, ensuring its smooth functioning and a dynamic learning environment.

The station's inaugural recording took place on August 10, 2021, featuring a message by Dr. Dhiman himself, recorded by the Public Relation Officer, Mr Lavlin Sachdeva. Operating at a frequency of 90.4 MHz, the CRS has been duly approved by the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting, Government of India.



Following test transmission in 2023, the station commenced regular broadcasts of four hours daily on September 16, 2024. Since then, it has hosted several eminent dignitaries from India and abroad, sharing their insights through recorded interviews and messages.

The daily broadcast begins with the station's signature tune, followed by Gurbani Kirtan, setting a culturally enriching tone. Programmes presented by students and faculty cover academics, research, cultural activities, outreach initiatives, and stakeholder engagement. Regular announcements about university events and important messages reach audiences within a radius of about 11 kilometres.

A daily programme for farmers features farm experts discussing the latest agricultural practices and techniques. Students actively contribute to various shows, gaining valuable opportunities to showcase their talent and enhance their communication skills. The “Know Your Teacher” series provides a unique platform for faculty members to share their academic journeys and professional experiences.

Highlighting its academic significance, Dr Dhiman describes the CRS as a living laboratory for students. It not only strengthens professional and communication skills but also connects GKU with the wider community by amplifying local voices, culture, and concerns. This initiative aligns closely with the vision of the NEP-2020, promoting experiential learning, skill development, and the integration of academics with real-world practice.

Distinguished visitors from India and abroad are also introduced to the CRS, often recording their messages and insights, thereby enriching the station's content and outreach. Guru Kashi University continues to amplify voices, nurture talent, and strengthen its bond with society. The CRS stands as a vibrant platform for knowledge sharing, student development, and meaningful community engagement.



Inquilab Zindabad was A Call for Transformation, Not Violence - Dr. Dhiman

Sri Aurobindo College of Commerce and Management, Ludhiana, solemnly observed Martyrdom Day on March 23, 2026, commemorating the sacrifice of Shaheed Bhagat Singh, Rajguru, and Sukhdev. Students, faculty, and distinguished guests gathered to reflect on their enduring relevance.

The keynote address was delivered by Dr. Jagtar Singh Dhiman, Vice Chancellor, Guru Kashi University, on “The Relevance of Bhagat Singh, Rajguru and Sukhdev for Youth in Contemporary Society.” Dr. Nirmal Jaura, Director Student Welfare, Punjab Agricultural University, graced the occasion as Guest of Honour. Welcoming the dignitaries, Principal Dr. Vishal Kumar emphasized reconnecting youth with ideals of sacrifice, justice, and nation-building.

Dr. Dhiman highlighted that for Bhagat Singh, freedom was incomplete without justice and an end to exploitation—whether colonial or domestic. He clarified that “*Inquilab*



Zindabad” signifies transformation of thought, society, and governance, not violence. Emphasizing critical thinking, he noted that Bhagat Singh urged questioning and reason over blind conformity.

He revisited key events, including the assassination of J.P. Saunders (1928) in response to Lala Lajpat Rai's death, and the Central Legislative Assembly incident (1929), where Bhagat Singh and Batukeshwar Dutt used a non-



lethal bomb “to make the deaf hear,” protesting repressive laws and willingly courting arrest to awaken national consciousness.

Describing Bhagat Singh as a global youth icon, Dr. Dhiman underscored his blend of courage and intellect, prioritization of ideas over narrow nationalism,

and supreme sacrifice. He called upon youth to embrace ethical living, social responsibility, and moral courage, stressing the continued relevance of building a just, integrity-driven society.

The programme reinforced the importance of Martyrdom Day in preserving national memory and inspiring principled action. Suggestions included instituting social innovation awards in the martyrs' names and promoting academic engagement with their ideology. Contemporary challenges - unemployment, corruption, social inequities, and education quality-

were also discussed, with a call for youth-centric policies.

The event concluded with a renewed commitment to uphold the values of justice, integrity, and fearless inquiry exemplified by the martyrs. Dr. Dhiman was honoured on the occasion with a shawl and a green bamboo plant.
